COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing is a half a quarter course consisting of two theory units and 2.5 clinical units. It is designed to prepare the student to utilize the Nursing Process in meeting patient's health-deviation self-care deficits with emphasis on Psychosocial needs. Theories of psychiatric mental health nursing will be taught in concert with nursing care of patients experiencing a wide range of psychiatric disorders and psychosocial deficits.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES (SLO's)

- 1. Apply own cultural background to concepts of mental health and mental illness.
- 2. Design a critical thinking component in relation to the nursing care of a patient with a given psychiatric diagnosis.
- 3. Demonstrate knowledge of Alcoholics Anonymous meetings and identify professional implications for the nurse.

- 3. <u>Note well:</u> Student's <u>exam total</u> needs to be <u>at least 75</u>% of maximum theory points in order to pass the course.
- 4. Please do <u>not</u> write on the exams or use folded or wrinkled scan-trons..
- 5. Asking questions of the instructor or talking during exams is not permitted. Please turn off cell phones prior to the exam.
- 6. Please take care of your personal needs prior to the exams so you will not have to leave the room during the exams.
- 7. **Exams must be taken on the dates and times scheduled.** Missing an exam is a serious matter and make-ups are not automatically given. In case of illness, a physician's letter may be required before a make-up will be considered. Non-Pass = less than 75% of total exam points or not satisfactorily completing all required assignments regardless of points accrued. In other words all "Required Assignments" are required for passing.

Note: The total <u>exam</u> score must be 150 points (average of 75% in theory) or better to pass the course. There will be no "rounding off" to reach the required 75 percent.

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Attendance at all theory sessions is expected (see Student Handbook 7.1-7.6, p. 19). <u>Punctuality</u> is also expected and not leaving early unless emergency or urgent situations.

CHEATING POLICY:

Cheating is not tolerated. During exams, you will be required to stagger your seating so you are a seat away on all sides in distance from others in the class. Plan to take care of personal needs prior to the exam as each student is expected to remain in the room until his or her exam is completed.

DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR:

 - Audiotaping of class is permitted only for the purpose of studying/learning while taking the course in which they were taped and they must be erased when the course is over. The student's written agreement to use taped materials exclusively for his or her studying during the course is required ahead of time. Taping may not be useful because the course consists of Instructor-led discussion, group presentations of case studies, (not 'stand-up lecture'). The best way to succeed and learn is to read and study the required readings and complete your "theory class outlines" PRIOR to each class and also to take advantage of the numerous online and workbook learning resources prior to each class meeting and to participate during class discussion and group presentations.
