Course Description:

This course develops high-intermediate reading comprehension, vocabulary, and writing skills using high-intermediate grammar. Students will be able to write well-organized and well-developed descriptive, narrative, and explanatory paragraphs. Also, students will work on summary writing and vocabulary development.

Student Learning Outcome Statements (SLO)

- 1. Develop high intermediate English reading comprehension skills and vocabulary building skills in extended written materials.
- 2. Demonstrate understanding and usage of high intermediate vocabulary in readings and writing.
- 3. Write well-developed, single and connected narrative, descriptive, and explanatory paragraphs demonstrating high intermediate grammar and vocabulary in response to reading materials.
- 4. Evaluate own writing for rhetorical structure, clarity, organization, and grammatical correctness by means of revision and editing.

Class Participation and Attendance:

Prompt and regular attendance is required. Being on time means being on Zoom by 8:30. It is important that you come to class prepared each day and ready to participate in class activities. Therefore, you must do your homework before you come to class. Your contribution to class activities will help you to better understand the coursework. Attendance and classwork is a critical part of your grade, so you should be active in class each meeting.

I expect you to have your cameras on during group discussions, break-out rooms, quizzes and exams. You will learn more efficiently by keeping your camera on during these times.

You will have both out-of-class and in-class paragraphs. Your paragraphs will include multiple drafts. It is important that you bring the first draft to class on the assigned day. If you do not have the first draft ready on the assigned day, five points will be taken off from the paragraph grade. *Paragraphs must be typed and double-spaced.

Doing your own work:

Be sure to turn in your own writing and to not have someone edit for you. It is fine to get help with ideas for your writing, but having someone correct your grammar errors will not help you.

Plagiarism is not acceptable. If you copy someone else's work, you will not receive credit for the assignment.

*** I also do not want you to use ChatGPT. It is important that you do the work on your own so that you can learn the necessary and useful skills that this class is teaching.
